Are Scottish engineers involved in space engineering? – **YES!**

More space satellites are designed and built in Glasgow than in any other city in Europe. East Scotland is a world leader in the engineering of Earth observation from satellites.

Steve Lee is an award winning astrophysicist and space engineer and is managing director of a commercial Astronautics, Space Technology and Earth Observation company - Stevenson Astrosat based in Musselburgh.

Steve will describe satellites in the near cosmos that provide storm tracking and monitoring of coastal erosion also earthquake/forest fire damage assessments producing interactive digital mapping of disaster situations to governments and direct to rescue teams in the field.

Astrosat also focus on Arctic communications and dangerous space debris tracking. They also work in the area of energy auditing via thermal infra-red imaging to identify energy inefficient city buildings etc to help clients reduce energy wastage and carbon emissions.
